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behavioral health fall forum

Dayton Children's Health Partners held their fall clinical quality forum entitled "Have no Fear, Behavioral Health Integration is Here!" this past September. The forum highlighted the work of integrating behavioral health specialists in the primary care setting. Physicians from Child and Adolescent Specialty Care, Shelby Pediatrics and PriMed shared their learnings thus far with co-location and integration pilots.

Dr. Ford of Child and Adolescent shared that they initially did not want to hire their own specialist because they were unsure they could keep someone busy. After having the services of Rachael Bell, LISW-S with the CIN doing integration clinics in their practice through the pilot, they are convinced they need someone and have recently posted the position. "Having access to someone we as pediatricians know and trust is invaluable to our patients," said Dr. Ford.

Dr. Eisenhut of PriMed, who hired Amy Hahn, LISW-S to imbed in one of their practice locations, said the patient and provider satisfaction of having an embedded specialist offers "off the board, higher satisfaction." Dr. Karen Smith of Shelby Pediatrics was able to share a patient success story using the Triple P (positive parenting program) training she received through the CIN.

Thank you to Dr. Kalpana Miriyala, Dayton Children's psychiatrist, our pilot physicians and the input of the behavioral health co-management work-group who all spent countless hours standing up the integration of behavioral health specialists in our pilot practices. The work continues as the goal is to have an integrated specialist – or two.... in ALL our CIN practices.
