Eligibility

- Completion of pediatric or maternal child rotation required
- Two completed reference forms from two nursing faculty members must be submitted by February 24, 2012 for application to be accepted.

CHOOSE FROM THE FOLLOWING PEDIATRIC SPECIALTY AREAS

Almost Home Unit

Provides outpatient diagnostic, therapeutic, interventional care as patients may stay up to 24-hours for observation or extended recovery.

Emergency Department

Provides urgent and emergent treatment for acutely ill patients

General Pediatrics

Provides nursing care for general medical/surgical patients.

Hematology/Oncology

This unit offers specialized care for patients diagnosed with cancer, sickle cell and related disorders.

Intermediate Care Unit

Provides care for children with chronic care needs, who are technology dependent and need close observation.

Newborn Intensive Care Unit

A Level III tertiary care center for the treatment of sick neonates and neonates requiring surgery.

Pediatric Intensive Care Unit

Provides the environment to care for the critically ill pediatric patient.

Float Nurse

Provides nursing care for children in the various inpatient units and the emergency department. Floats to the various units based on unit needs.
