itching, dry skin, rash, cracked skin, and darkening or creasing of skin around the eyes

more on atopic dermatitis


- Atopic dermatitis (AD) is considered to be part of the "atopic march." This involves the diagnosis of eczema, food allergy, allergic rhinitis, and asthma — typically in that sequential order
- Studies show up to 80 percent of children with eczema develop asthma and/or allergic rhinitis later in childhood
- With the high prevalence of co-existing allergies, guidelines recommend testing for allergies in certain patients
- Unmanaged AD can have a significant impact on quality of life for the patient and family
