Individualized Curriculum (IC): Fellows are granted 32 weeks (8 EUs) for individualized curriculum over the 2-year fellowship program. Blocks can be divided into 2-week or 4-week blocks based on the fellow's individual goals. See list below of example individualized curriculum electives available to the fellow. Electives may include clinical and nonclinical electives.

Core Rotations: Fellows are required to complete 32 weeks (8 EUs) of core clinical rotations over the 2-year fellowship. Core rotations include Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU), Newborn Nursery, Transitional Care Unit (TCU) and Complex Care (Includes palliative care), Community Pediatric Hospital Medicine, Pediatric Hospital Medicine at Dayton Children's which includes the following: Teaching teams, Admission team, Consult and Co-management team, Night Float, and the required Longitudinal Patient Safety Course.

Systems and Scholarship (S&S): Fellows are required to complete 32 weeks (8 EUs) dedicated to scholarly activity over the 2-year fellowship including the development of requisite skills, project completion, and presentation of results to the Scholarship Oversight Committee. The required longitudinal quality improvement course with capstone project is included in S&S time in year 1 of fellowship.

Vacation: Fellows are entitled to 4 weeks of vacation each year of the 2-year fellowship. Vacation cannot be taken during "Core" rotation blocks.
